Thank you for giving us this agenda time.

I am representing concerned residents of Boulder. An opinion survey has been circulated about the proposed pedestrian path. We have electronically forwarded that to you and here will provide a hard copy that includes additional signatures to what was previously submitted. Please include all of this as an attachment in a link on the town's website (including what I am stating tonight).

As you will see - most of the more than 125 residents and property owners who signed this survey oppose the path outright. Approximately 10% of participants believe that the process needs to slow-down to provide more input to determine the community needs and how this path may fit into the overall transportation infrastructure in Boulder Town.

We respect that the Town leadership was proactive in pursuing this funding opportunity. We are, however, very concerned about the lack of community engagement. We know that this process was not conducted in the way that communities normally seek federal funding from UDOT, that is - based on a plan and a shared vision within the community.

It has been stated repeatedly that questions have been answered, but it is not the experience of the signees of this petition that we have any certainty about the proposed financial cost to the town and the subsequent tax increase to the residents of Boulder.

UDOT is aware that this is a controversial project, stating that this is the only project out of 26 they are considering funding which has resulted in public records requests and community correspondence. They told us during the Special Meeting on July 19, 2023 that the community and Council need to come together to support this project. We intend to share these petitions and the concerns of the residents with UDOT.

We also understand from UDOT that the Town does not need to make a formal decision at this point but has the chance to make changes that may better fit the needs of Boulder Town.

Given the concerns, but recognizing the opportunity, we request that you form the committee that Elizabeth Julian proposed to work with the Council to gather community input, analyze the initial and ongoing costs, address the concerns that have been raised, and align the interests of all. We ask that you take this action before you make a final decision on how to pursue this project. If you are unwilling to form a working group, we formally request that this process be halted in its entirety.
